
What's been happening at our schools.

Marcus Rashford's Book Club:



Science Week: Each class planned, tested, then carried out some scientific experiments. These were then shared in the assembly. Primary 4 looked at recreating the Dead Sea floating effect. Primary 2 looked at the effects of oil in water, creating a Lava Lamp.

There have been trips to exciting places such as Frylands to do Sumo Wrestling. Primary 1 have been exploring the woods in Forrest skills led by Ms Kelly. As restrictions were lifted some classes have been lucky enough to go on some thrill-seeking adventures. Bramley Bank teamed up with Tharreo House to take on Legoland which proved a big success. Chessington World of Adventures was then conquered by Primary 2 and 4. Primary 2 have been making some unlikely friends at the ARK centre where they have been learning and caring about all the animals the ARK centre has to offer.



What's been going on in our classes?

Primary 1

In Primary 1 we have been very busy this summer term. In Maths we have been focusing on partitioning numbers and working on our multiplication. In English we looked at Jack and the Beanstalk in great depth and reviewing the emotions of the characters. We have had a very creative term with Ms Kelly. We have been doing so many activities. These include gardening which is helping with organisation and fine motor skills as well as exploring with arts and crafts creating wonderful masterpieces. In history we have been looking at the life of Florence Nightingale and what she has done. In Science we have been looking at forces and magnets in world around us. During activity time Primary 1 have been visiting the Frylands centre where pupils have been taking part in various activities.

Primary 2

This year is another year that is going to go down in the history books. It has been such a pleasure teaching Primary 2 through the ups and downs of Lockdown, returning to school, being in bubbles and social distancing. All the children in Primary 2 have all done so well, socially, emotionally and academically they have managed to make progress throughout the year. During Science this year we have explored different types of habitats and learnt how to take care of the environment. We have also done some fantastic experiments during Science week, making lava lamps, measuring the weight of gas in cold drinks and making rain clouds.

Primary 3

Primary 3 have been very busy this year, with a big focus on sports and play management, building on social skills vital for the progression to Key Stage 3. In Literacy we have been looking at poems. The class managed to write poems that personifies the weather. In Science we have been looking at the concept of light and the life cycle. Primary 3 produced some excellent work. In History we explored mummification in Ancient Egypt!

Primary 4

Primary 4 have been very busy, they have read Louis Sachar's 'Holes' which the pupils provided some beautiful pieces of work in their Big Write lessons as well as looking at the bizarre 'Salamanders Dream' by Hope Larson. In Maths, most recently, students have been looking at the properties of shapes and then furthering this knowledge by looking at the angles in shapes. Whilst COVID-19 put a halt on SATs, Primary 4 were still very busy doing revision for assessments, whilst doing this they have been exploring their artistic side to break up the academic learning. It is evident that Primary 4 has some Banky's in the making! Science has been 'Shocking!' We have been exploring the topic of 'Exciting Electricity'. They have been giving being a scientist a try by doing experiments such as the 'Egg VS Gravity drop' and the 'Dead Sea Test' which replicates the Dead Sea. We are sad to see our leavers go but we are so impressed with journey each pupil has taken, how much they have grown and accomplished and what greatness lies ahead. Good Luck!
