CAREERS

Two of our Beckmead students have now received paid job offers from their work experience – Hooray!

The British Army Career Outreach Event: We recently welcomed the recruiting team from the British Army to deliver some fantastic career workshops and team building activities to our year 10, 11, 12 & 13 students. A military police officer gave a talk on his career journey into the army and showed students some videos about the different training opportunities available to them.

Students then took part in activities led by non-commissioning officers from the Scots guard Infantry and Rifleman regiments.

University Visits: Raising students aspiration is at the heart of our careers programme. This year students visited both Kingston and Surrey University. Students were given guided tours around campus - visiting lecture rooms, living accommodations (dorms) and sporting facilities.

More and more Beckmead students are becoming work ready for a career in construction due to them achieving their Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) qualification. This undoubtably provides students with greater opportunities to secure paid employment once they leave us, as most contractors and major builders within the UK require anyone working on building sites to hold a valid CSCS card.



VOCATIONAL

This academic year has been an exciting time for the vocational area, we have seen some amazing projects from our pupils who have given 100% effort, ensuring quality and style. Projects include making a bench from recycled material and refurbishing tables.

Staff embraced the opportunity to deliver standalone City and Guilds qualifications for year 12 and 13 students. The change in our delivery of subjects means that students can specialise in their chosen vocational area.

This term the vocational department reached out to the community with all year groups helping to build and restore a very tired summer house for our local residential care home (for the elderly). Residents and staff were amazed at the outcome of this project, in addition we restored a bench to keep the area looking fresh and inviting. As the Vocational manager I couldn't be prouder of the vocational staff stepping up and pushing to get the very best for every pupil.
