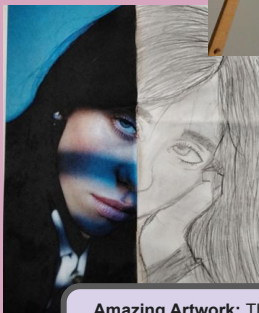


Student Recognition: Mr Davie recognised various student accomplishments, including **Kye's** focus on a building project and **Ruby's** artwork.
